The Selected Jurors Subcommittee of the Public Service and Trust Commission Jury Committee met at the offices of Day Pitney, LLP, 242 Trumbull Street, Hartford, CT 06103 on March 16, 2009 at 5:00 p.m.

The subcommittee was called to order at approximately 5:25 p.m. by Dean Brad Saxton, chair of the subcommittee.

Dean Saxton welcomed Attorney Goodrow to the subcommittee and asked all subcommittee members to introduce themselves.

4. The subcommittee members discussed narrowing their current master work list (attachment A) into about five categories. Dean Saxton will be producing a revised list and distributing to all subcommittee members before the next scheduled meeting.
