MARKING PROCEDURES

Matters printed on the short calendar must be marked "READY" to be considered by the Court.

Short calendar markings may be made from 9:00 in the morning on the Friday before the short calendar until 4:00 in the afternoon of the Monday before the short calendar. If a state holiday falls on a Tuesday before the date of the calendar, matters may be marked from 9:00 Friday morning until 11:00 Monday morning.

If a calendar is canceled due to unexpected events, parties may reclaim their motions to the next available calendar. If, however, the matter needs immediate action by the court, the party may apply for permission to schedule an earlier hearing date with the court.

Note: all citations must be re-issued unless the court orders otherwise.

Markings by attorneys must be made electronically through E-Services (www.jud.ct.gov). Self-represented (pro se) parties and attorneys who have obtained an exclusion from E-Services requirements must submit markings by calling 203-503-6802.

Note: Fax markings are not accepted.

Counsel and self-represented parties must give timely notice of markings to all self-represented parties and counsel of record. The court may impose sanctions if notice is not given.

The following information must be given when making a telephone marking:

- The position of the case on the calendar
- The name and docket number of the case
- The entry number and title of motion
- The full name of the person making the marking and the law firm name, if applicable
- Confirmation that counsel and self-represented parties of record have been notified of the marking

For matters marked "READY," counsel and self-represented parties of record must come to court on the day of the calendar. The court will attempt to hear cases in which a party is represented by a volunteer (pro bono) attorney first.

NEW: FAMILY DISCOVERY AND DEPOSITION MOTIONS - REVISED PRACTICE BOOK SECTION 25-34

Starting August 15, 2011, motions filed pertaining to discovery or deposition in family matters pursuant to Chapter 13 of the Connecticut Practice Book are nonarguable. If you have filed any such motion, once it appears on the family short calendar the matter will be ruled on without hearing, unless the court has determined that oral argument or the presentation of testimony is necessary, in which case all appearing parties will be notified. All other family short calendar matters remain arguable.
