

2020 Connecticut Supreme Court Historical Society Law Day: About the Contest on the Right to Vote

\$1,000 AWARDS AND WINNERS MEET CONNECTICUT SUPREME COURT JUSTICES

Entry Deadline: April 9, 2020

About the Contest: This annual contest provides an opportunity to win prizes, learn about our legal system and get creative. The contest can be incorporated into a curriculum, offered as extra credit, or just done for fun. Both individual and team submissions are accepted.

2020 Law Day Theme: This year's Law Day theme commemorates the 100th anniversary of the 19th Amendment and the women's right to vote. As stated by the American Bar Association: "The 2020 Law Day theme is 'Your Vote, Your Voice, Our Democracy: The 19th Amendment at 100.' In 2019-2020, the United States is commemorating the centennial of the transformative constitutional amendment that guaranteed the right of citizens to vote would not be denied or abridged by the United States or any state on account of sex. American women fought for, and won, the vote through their voice and action."

Building on this theme, the Connecticut Supreme Court Historical Society's Law Day competition focuses on the following question:

One hundred years after the passage of the Nineteenth Amendment, what obstacles still remain for citizens seeking to exercise their right to vote, and how do we surmount them?

Submission and Criteria: Two categories of submissions:

1. **ART:** Two-dimensional art pieces should not exceed 24" x 36" (including, but not limited to, drawings, paintings, photographs, comics, etc.).
2. **WRITTEN:** Written essay limited to 250 words.

Submissions should reflect on and respond to the above question. Criteria: the submissions will be evaluated on originality, quality, creativity and clarity of expression of the theme.

Eligibility: The Law Day Contest is open to students, student groups, and classes attending a public or private high school, or being home schooled, within Connecticut and in grades 9-12 or the

equivalent. All qualified participants under the age of 18 must have their parent or guardian sign the Parental Permission Release found on the Entry Form.

Recognition and Awards: One winner for each category will receive a prize of \$1,000 (to an individual or a team). The winners will be recognized at the Law Day celebration to be held on May 1, 2020 at the Connecticut Supreme Court, Hartford, where the winners and their families will have the opportunity to meet with the Chief Justice and the Associate Justices of the Connecticut Supreme Court.



2020 Connecticut Supreme Court Historical Society Law Day: Official Contest Rules

\$1,000 AWARDS AND WINNERS MEET CONNECTICUT SUPREME COURT JUSTICES

Contest Prizes: One winner for each category will receive a cash award of \$1,000 (to an individual or a team), will meet with the Chief Justice and the Associate Justices of the Connecticut Supreme Court and participate in the Connecticut Supreme Court Law Day on May 1, 2020. **Entry Deadline:** April 9, 2020

Contest Theme:

Background: The Law Day Contest asks participants to explore the 19th Amendment and the women's right to vote. As stated by the American Bar Association: "The 2020 Law Day theme is 'Your Vote, Your Voice, Our Democracy: The 19th Amendment at 100.' In 2019-2020, the United States is commemorating the centennial of the transformative constitutional amendment that guaranteed the right of citizens to vote would not be denied or abridged by the United States or any state on account of sex. American women fought for, and won, the vote through their voice and action. Contest Focus: Building on this theme, the Connecticut Supreme Court Historical Society's Law Day competition focuses on the following question:

One hundred years after the passage of the Nineteenth Amendment, what obstacles still remain for citizens seeking to exercise their right to vote, and how do we surmount them?

Qualified Participants: The Law Day Contest is open to students, student groups, and classes attending a public or private high school, or being home schooled, within Connecticut and in grades 9-12 or the equivalent.

Group Submissions: Two or more Qualified Participants may submit a group entry. Qualified Participants need not be from the same school. However, all students must meet Contest Eligibility Requirements and must complete the Law Day Contest Entry Form with Parental Permission.

Contest Eligibility Requirements: Qualified participants may enter a submission under either of the following categories (each submission may only be submitted in one category):

1. ART: Two-dimensional art pieces are not to exceed 24" x 36" (including, but not limited to, drawings, paintings, photographs, comics, etc.).
2. WRITTEN: Written essay limited to 250 words (including, but not limited to, short story, essay, poetry, etc.).

Sponsors: The 2020 Law Day Contest is sponsored by the Connecticut Supreme Court Historical Society (sponsor) and the Contest prizes are made possible through the generous donations by the Society's supporters.

Steps to Enter: Qualified Participants must:

1. Agree to the contest Rules. To do so, you may find the Contest Entry Form and a copy of the Contest Rules at www.jud.ct.gov/historicalsociety/. All submissions must be accompanied by a signed and completed Law Day Contest Entry Form signed by participants or parent/guardian as applicable.

3. Contest entries will be accepted beginning February 14, 2020. To be eligible for prizes, all entries must be received by April 9, 2020.

Contest Description:

1. Selection of winners will be based on originality, creativity, clarity of expression of the theme, and overall quality.
2. The Connecticut Supreme Court Historical Society Law Day Contest Committee will select no more than one winner for each of the two categories from among the Eligible Entries that meet minimum quality standards and best reflect the theme. Winners will be contacted by email or phone and will be posted on the Connecticut Supreme Court Historical Society website.
3. By completing and signing the Entry Form, each Participant assents to the republication, reproduction, or any other use of the submissions and the likenesses and personas

contained therein by the Connecticut Supreme Court Historical Society. Each Law Day Contest Entry Form must certify the submission is the original work of the Qualified Participant(s). Submissions are subject to verification for compliance with these Rules. Qualified Participants are not limited to one entry, but will only be eligible to win one prize.

Privacy: Any and all names, contact information, and related information should be submitted only on the Entry Form. Names, contact information, or any other personally identifiable information should not be included within the submission (for example, on a “credit roll”), as the submitted pieces may be displayed on publicly accessible websites. If personally identifiable information is presented within the submission, the Connecticut Supreme Court Historical Society may void or deem the submission ineligible.

All submissions must be the original work of the participants (for purposes of these rules, “participant(s)” mean the parent or guardian signing the entry form if applicable and the student.

Participants must not have granted any other person or entity prior right to use the piece. Submissions will not be accepted or eligible if they include any content that contains or appears to contain:

1. Profane, obscene, or inappropriate language, contest or material or gratuitous violence.
2. Endorses, encourages, or condones drug use, underage drinking, alcohol abuse or other illegal activity.
3. Any express or implied commercial endorsement.
4. Any derogatory characterization of any person or group based on age, race, color, gender, gender identity and expression, sexual orientation, religious beliefs, marital status, mental or physical disability, citizenship, creed, national origin, physical appearance, political affiliation, union membership, or other unethical or unlawful factors.
5. By submitting entries, participants warrant that the contents of the submitted piece do not infringe on any copyright owned by another, and/or that the content of the piece is within the bounds of the fair use doctrine. Participants also confirm that to the best of their knowledge, any statements made in the submitted piece are true and do not violate or infringe on the rights of third parties.

Conditions of Participation:

1. By entering, participants agree to defend and indemnify sponsor(s) and sponsor's principals, subsidiaries, affiliates, directors, officers, employees, members, and agents from any and all liability for any injuries, loss, or damage of any kind arising from or in connection with the contest or as a result of receiving participants' submissions and/or misuse of any prize.

2. Each participant agrees that the sponsor(s) may retain a copy of the submission and also consents, approves and authorizes the sponsor the right to use, broadcast, webcast, or otherwise exhibit or display the submitted pieces.
3. Each participant grants the sponsor(s) the unqualified right to use his or her name and submission entries, in connection with promoting or marketing the contest or its theme, and future contests, materials or as the sponsor(s) determine.
4. The rights described in these official rules begin immediately upon submission.
5. The sponsor has no obligation to post or display any submitted piece and may in its absolute discretion, remove any submitted pieces at any time.
6. The participant releases the sponsor and sponsor's principals, subsidiaries, affiliates, directors, officers, employees, members, and agents from any and all claims by third parties or the participant in connection with the submitted piece.

General Conditions:

1. The Connecticut Supreme Court Historical Society is and shall be the final arbiter of the contest and applicability of these rules.
2. The sponsor reserves the right to void entries it deems associated with any form of tampering.
3. Should technical or other difficulties arise that compromise the integrity of the contest, the sponsor may cancel, modify or suspend the contest without notice. In that case, the sponsor reserves the right to award the prizes from eligible entries received before the cancellation.
4. The sponsor is not responsible for any technical malfunction or service outage related to the contest.
