

Minutes of the Meeting
Rules Committee of the Superior Court
Monday, May 13, 2024

On May 13, 2024, beginning at 10:00 a.m. the Rules Committee of the Superior Court conducted a public hearing in person and, simultaneously, by way of *Microsoft Teams*, to receive comments concerning proposed revisions to the Practice Book and, pursuant to subsection (c) of Section 51-14 of the Connecticut General Statutes, to receive comments on any proposed new rule or change in existing rule that any member of the bar or the public deemed desirable.
