MINUTES

Board of Directors Meeting – March 09, 2015

President Wesley Horton called the meeting to order at 2:00 p.m. in the Supreme Court Lawyers Lounge. Others present were: Kathy Calibey, Greg D'Auria, John Farley, Molly LeVan, Barbara Schellenberg, Jon Weiner, Mike Widener, Kit Collier, Mike Besso, Judge Cohn and Justice Zarella.

Mr. Horton noted that the Board meeting scheduled for January 12, 2015, had failed to attract a quorum of the Board. Therefore, no actions were taken at that meeting and a new meeting was scheduled for this date.

Mr. D'Auria moved the approval of the minutes of the Board's September 8, 2014 meeting. Ms. Calibey seconded the motion, and the minutes were approved.

Mr. Howard was not present, but he did submit a Treasurer's report dated March 15, 2015 (attached). Ms. Calibey moved acceptance of the report. Prof. Collier seconded the motion and the Treasurer's Report was approved.

Ms. Calibey reported for the Programs Committee that Todd Brewster would speak at the Society's annual dinner, scheduled for April 23, 2015. His topic would involve the subject of his book, "Lincoln's Gamble." Also for the Programs Committee, Ms. LeVan reported that the Society is supporting the conference being presented on March 26, 2015 by the Young Lawyers Section of the Connecticut Bar Association (CBA), at 6:00 at the Hartford Club.

Mr. Besso reported on the Society's proposed license agreement with EBESCO. This issue had been tabled at the Board's September 8, 2014 meeting while Mr. Besso acquired further information. (See Mr. Besso's report to the board attached to the minutes of the September 8, 2014). Mr. Besso provided that further information (see attachments) and after discussion Mr. Widener moved that the Board approve entering the agreement with EBESCO. Mr. Farley seconded the motion. Mr. Widener then further moved that the Board authorize the Editor in Chief of the Journal to enter the agreement on the Board's behalf. Mr. Farley also seconded that motion. Both motions were approved.

President Horton designated Mr. D'Auria, Ms. LeVan and Mr. Weiner to serve as the nominating committee to make a report to the Board at the next meeting.

Mr. Besso reported that the newest issue of the Journal, devoted to *Cologne v. Westfarms Mall*, should be in the mail before our annual meeting April 23, 2015. He also reported that he is looking for other topics for upcoming issues.

Mr. Farley reported for the Finance Committee that the Society's membership is around 100 members and that some are using the on-line pay pal method for paying dues.


After a discussion about ways to increase membership, especially among new lawyers, Mr. Farley presented two motions: First, he proposed that the Society offer a free one year membership to new lawyers admitted to the Bar at the swearing-in ceremonies, as they occur. Second, he proposed that the Society offer a free one year membership to any law students or members of the Young Lawyers Section of the CBA who attend the March 26, 2015 program Ms. LeVan discussed earlier in the meeting. Mr. Weiner seconded both motions and they were both approved.

After a discussion about efforts to increase membership among attorneys downstate, President Horton asked Barbara Schellenberg to work with John Farley on the Finance Committee to determine what efforts might be appropriate.

Mr. Widener of the Archives Committee announced that he would once again host a tour of the Yale Law Library's most recent exhibit, this one entitled "250 Years of Blackstone's Commentaries." This will occur at the Yale Law Library at 3:30 on April 23, 2015, the same date as the Society's annual meeting and dinner at the New Haven Lawn Club, which begins at 5:30.

Mr. Horton announced that the next Board meeting would take place on April 23, 2015, at 5:00 p.m., at the New Haven Lawn Club, just after Mr. Widener's tour and before the annual dinner.

At 2:40, Prof. Collier moved to adjourn the meeting. Mr. D'Auria seconded the motion, and the meeting was adjourned.

LICENSE AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT is made and entered into this the ____ day of August, 2014 by and between EBSCO Publishing, Inc., whose principal place of business is at 10 Estes Street, Ipswich, Massachusetts, 01938-0682, USA ("EP") and Connecticut Supreme Court Historical Society, whose principal place of business is at _____ ("Licensor").

WHEREAS, Licensor has the right to publish or cause to be published certain content within the Publications (as hereinafter defined); and

WHEREAS, Licensor desires to license EP to disseminate the Content (as hereinafter defined) of the Publications, in text, image, other electronic format or such other formats or on such other media as may now exist or hereafter be discovered, to end-users through the re-license or sale of information products using the media of CD-ROM, tape, online hosts, internet services and other electronic or optical media or formats now known or hereafter discovered.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual promises and covenants contained in this Agreement, and for other good and valuable consideration, EP and Licensor hereby agree as follows:

1. **Definitions.** The following terms shall be used in this Agreement as defined in this Section 1:

1.1 "Adapt", EP shall make no change to the editorial content of the Publication(s) licensed hereunder. Notwithstanding the above, EP shall be entitled to insert into each transmission such subject or descriptor field and codes, instructions and other technical applications as may be necessary to make the Content compatible with the database structure and search logic of the Products and to normalize data elements to facilitate Product usage.

1.2 "Publications" are the titles listed in Schedule 1, as may be amended from time to time, and which is incorporated into this Agreement by this reference.

1.3 "Content" is for text, image and other content contained within the Publications, as provided by Licensor.

1.4 "Current Content" is Content that Licensor publishes after the expiration or termination of this Agreement.

1.5 "Discovery Content" means all current and future titles published by Licensor, within the term and scope of this Agreement. Additional Discovery Content shall be automatically added to this Agreement as soon as it is published by Licensor and shall be provided to EP by Licensor to be used in accordance with Section 2.7 herein.

1.6 "Logo" shall mean the marks or trademarked banner graphics owned by Licensor which are used on the cover of each issue of the Publications.

1.7 "Past Content" is Content that Licensor published and that EP included in Products during the term of this Agreement.

1.8 "Products" are information products distributed by EP (and by virtue of agreements with EP, by EP's distributors, resellers, agents, and sublicensees), which contain all or part of the Content of the Publications, listed in Schedule 2, as may be amended from time to time, and which is incorporated into this Agreement by this reference.

1.9 "User" shall mean third persons or organizations that have entered into agreements with EP and/or its distributors, resellers, agents or sublicensees respecting the Products.

2. **Grant of License**

2.1 Licensor grants to EP the non-exclusive right and license to reproduce, distribute reproductions of, display, publicly perform, and Adapt the Content for purposes of incorporating the Content into the Products, and allowing the

reproduction, distribution of reproductions of, the display of, public performance of, and adaptation of the Content as used in the Products. EP will not make the Products available to persons or entities that are not authorized Users. EP will not authorize or permit any User to re-sell the Content, or any part thereof. However, university Users may, in return for an additional subscription fee on which royalties will be paid in accordance with Section 4 herein, make EP's alumni Products available to their alumni as a component of a larger package of services offered to alumni. Nothing in this Section is intended to restrict Licensor's right to promote its own print or electronic subscriptions or products which include the Publications, nor to limit its ability to reach agreements with other subscription agents or distributors.

2.2 Licensor shall retain all right, title, copyright, and other intellectual or proprietary rights in the Publications. EP does not acquire any intellectual property or other rights in the Publications except as specifically acknowledged in this Agreement.

2.3 If, during the term of this Agreement, Licensor provides the Content of the Publications for inclusion on a product or service which is available at no cost then EP reserves the right to reduce or eliminate the royalties paid pursuant to Section 4. For the avoidance of doubt, nothing in this Section is intended to restrict Licensor's right to promote its own print or electronic subscriptions by providing only a selected, minority portion of Content of the Publications in a product or service which is provided at no cost.

2.4 The use of the Licensor's trademark(s) is subject to review and approval of the Licensor, however, general purpose materials, such as database catalogs, price lists, Customer Listserv Messages and other customer communications or other materials providing a general listing of services or databases, shall not require specific review or approval. To promote Licensor's brand recognition, EP may display the Publication's Logo only in conjunction with display of a full text article from the Publication. EP may also use the Publication's cover images, if provided by Licensor, in marketing and promotional materials.

2.5 Licensor authorizes EP to sublicense Content in exchange for additional royalties beyond that listed in Section 4, which royalties will be calculated in a manner equal to the method set forth in Section 4.1 of this Agreement. EP will sublicense such sublicensees to reproduce, distribute reproductions of, display, publicly perform, and adapt the Content and the Products, and will allow the reproduction, distribution of reproductions of, the display of, public performance of, and adaptation of the Content, in all media now known or hereafter discovered, providing revenues from guaranteed sources, subscription packages, or transactional (pay-per-view) models. Upon written notice to EP by Licensor, EP will direct sublicensees to remove Content identified by the Licensor. EP reserves the right to direct sublicensees to remove any Content in which the ownership or right to license is called into question. Licensor will indicate whether it accepts or declines this option by indicating its agreement on Schedule 3, which is incorporated herein by this reference.

2.6 Licensor agrees to make best efforts to include information in the masthead of the Publications indicating that the Publications are included in EP's Products.

2.7 Licensor grants EP the right to make the Discovery Content on EP's servers available to major search engines and EBSCO Discovery Service to crawl in order to make Users aware of the Discovery Content. Licensor shall provide the following data for the Discovery Content: all the full text and metadata elements with information that facilitates a link from the metadata to the full text on an online server. The search engines and EBSCO Discovery Service may search the full text and display a limited portion of the Discovery Content so that Users can connect to the Content via the result lists.

2.8 EP may, at its option, include the Content of the Publications beginning with Volume 1, Issue 1 to the extent such Content is affirmatively provided by Licensor to EP for inclusion in the EP Products (the "Permitted Content").

3. **Development of the Products**

3.1 Licensor will deliver the Permitted Content of the Publications to EP in a timely manner in a mutually agreed upon format and medium, as stated in Schedule 1.

3.2 Licensor agrees to deliver the best available data for the Permitted Content of the Publications, without charge to EP, according to the schedule stated in Schedule 1. If applicable, Licensor agrees to authorize EP to download Content for Publications from any third party providers and to cover all associated costs (if any).

4. **Payments and Reports**

4.1 EP shall pay Licensor earned royalties on a quarterly basis. Such earned royalties will be equal to twenty percent (20 %) of the net revenue collected for inclusion of Content from the Publications on Products sold.

4.2 EP shall make payments due to Licensor pursuant to this Agreement within ninety (90) days after the last day of the calendar quarter in which use of the Content of the Publications in the Products commenced.

4.3 For Products in which only citation and abstract information from Licensor are included, and no text or image of the article is included, no royalty will be earned by Licensor.

5. **Representations and Warranties**

5.1 EP represents and warrants that it has the right to enter into this Agreement and to cause the Products to be sold in the form and in the manner set forth in this Agreement. Licensor represents and warrants to EP that: (a) Licensor has the right to enter into this Agreement with EP, (b) Licensor has the right to allow or cause the Permitted Content of the Publications to be licensed in the form and manner set forth in this Agreement, and (c) Licensor owns all right, title, and interest in and to, including the copyright in and to, the Publications being licensed pursuant to this Agreement, and the individual items of Permitted Content, or with respect to individual items of Permitted Content, the right and license to allow EP to use the Permitted Content as contemplated by this Agreement.

5.2 EP indemnifies Licensor (and its officers, directors and partners) from and against any and all liability, damage, loss or expense arising from any claim, demand, action or proceeding based upon or arising out of the breach or alleged breach of any of the representations or warranties set forth in this Agreement or incurred in the settlement or avoidance of any such claim, provided, however, that Licensor shall give prompt legal notice to EP of the assertion of any such claim and provided further that EP shall have the right to participate in the defense thereof at its own expense. This agreement to indemnify shall survive any termination or expiration of this License Agreement.

5.3 Licensor indemnifies EP (and its parents, affiliates, officers, directors and partners) from and against any and all liability, damage, loss or expense arising from any claim, demand, action or proceeding based upon or arising out of the breach or alleged breach of any of the representations or warranties set forth in this Agreement or incurred in the settlement or avoidance of any such claim, provided, however, that EP shall give prompt legal notice to Licensor of the assertion of any such claim and provided further that Licensor shall have the right to participate in the defense thereof at its own expense. This agreement to indemnify shall survive any termination or expiration of this License Agreement.

6. **Copyright and Infringement**

6.1 Copyright of the Publications remains the property of Licensor. All Permitted Content included in EP Products will credit Licensor as having previously published such Permitted Content and carry a copyright notice substantially in the form: "© [Year] Connecticut Supreme Court Historical Society and/or its licensors. All rights reserved." EP's customers agree to abide by the Copyright Act of 1976 as well as any contractual restrictions, copyright restrictions, or other restrictions provided by publishers and specified in the Products. Pursuant to these terms and conditions, the customer and Users may download, email or print limited copies of citations, abstracts, full text or portions thereof provided the information is used solely for personal, non-commercial use. EP instructs its customers that they may not use the Products as a component of or the basis of any other publication prepared for sale and will neither duplicate nor alter the Products or any of the content therein in any manner nor use same for sale or distribution. EP informs the customer that it must take all reasonable precautions to limit the usage of the Product(s) to those specifically authorized.

6.2 Each party will use reasonable efforts to notify the other of any allegations of infringements of patent, copyright, trademark or other intellectual property rights in the Products that come to such party's attention.

6.3 EP acknowledges and agrees that Licensor may, with respect to any Content or any Publication, or a portion thereof, request EP to remove or cease distributing any portion of the Content or the Publications which Licensor reasonably believes may be in violation of law or the proprietary or contractual rights of a third party, and EP will reasonably cooperate with Licensor in that regard. In the event that Licensor requests that EP remove or cease distributing more than five percent (5%) of the total Content licensed by Licensor to EP pursuant to this Agreement, then EP's obligation to pay royalties pursuant to Section 4 of this Agreement shall be reduced on a prorated basis consistent with the percentage of Content subject to removal or cessation of distribution.

7. Confidentiality

7.1 Neither party shall, without the written consent of the other, or as specified below, communicate confidential information of the other orally or in writing (including, without limitation, future business plans and services and the identity and addresses of the Users) to any third party and shall protect such information from inadvertent disclosure to any third party in the same manner that it protects its own confidential information. Each party's obligations of confidentiality and non-disclosure shall not apply to disclosures to such party's counsel or other advisors or to a court, arbitration panel or other similar body, in the event such party has a bona fide dispute with the other party regarding this Agreement.

7.2 Both parties further agree that all confidentiality commitments hereunder shall survive any termination or expiration of the Agreement.

8. Term and Termination

8.1 The term of this Agreement shall commence on the date first set forth above and shall automatically renew on the date which is three (3) years thereafter, subject to successive one year renewals of this Agreement on the terms contained herein unless either party hereto provides written notice to the other party at least ninety (90) days in advance of any renewal date of its intention not to renew this Agreement.

8.2 This Agreement may be terminated by either party on written notice of termination, upon material breach of any obligation hereunder by the other party, if such other party fails to cure such breach within sixty (60) days after written notice thereof.

8.3 This Agreement may be terminated immediately by either party in the event an order for relief in any bankruptcy or reorganization proceeding is entered against the other party, a receiver is appointed for all or substantially all of the assets of the other party, the other party is dissolved or liquidated other than in connection with a sale of all or substantially all of its assets, the other party completely discontinues its business other than in connection with a sale of all or substantially all of its assets, or the other party attempts to assign this Agreement in contravention thereof.

8.4 Upon termination of this Agreement, each party shall promptly return to the other all confidential and business-sensitive information in tangible form which is then in possession or control of such party. After termination, EP will no longer have any license to include Current Content from Publications in its Products, but may continue to include Past Content from the Publications in its Products, in exchange for a one-time lump sum payment equal to the previous twelve months' royalties earned pursuant to Section 4.1 of the Agreement. This payment shall be made within thirty days of termination of this Agreement.

9. Force Majeure

Neither party shall be deemed in default of this Agreement to the extent that performance of its obligations or attempts to cure any breach are delayed or prevented by reason of any act of God, fire, natural disaster, accident, act of government, labor difficulty, sabotage, failure of suppliers or subcontractors or unavailability of material or supplies or

any other cause beyond the control of such party ("Force Majeure"), provided that such party gives the other party written notice thereof promptly and in any event, within fifteen (15) days of discovery thereof. In the event of such a Force Majeure, the time for performance or cure shall be extended for a period equal to the duration of the Force Majeure but not in excess of six (6) months.

10. **Limitation of Liability**

Neither party shall be liable to the other for special, incidental, consequential or punitive damages of any nature, for any reason, including, without limitation, the breach of the Agreement or any termination of this Agreement, whether such liability is asserted on the basis of contract, tort (including negligence or strict liability) or otherwise, even if the other party has been warned of the possibility of such damages. Except as provided herein, all remedies, including, without limitation, the termination of this Agreement and all of the remedies provided by law shall be deemed cumulative and not exclusive.

11. **Assignment**

This Agreement shall be binding upon, and shall inure to the benefit of the parties hereto and their respective successors and assigns; provided, that this Agreement may not be assigned in whole or in part by either party without the written consent of the other, except that Licensor may assign this Agreement to any other entity controlled by Licensor without the consent of EP and EP may assign this Agreement to any affiliate without the consent of Licensor. Either party may, with the other's written consent, which consent shall not be unreasonably withheld or delayed, assign this Agreement to any person or entity which succeeds to its business to which this Agreement relates and which assumes all of its obligations hereunder in writing, provided that in such event the assigning party or its legal successor-in-interest shall remain bound as a guarantor of such obligations.

12. **Notices**

All notices required or permitted hereunder shall be in writing and shall be sent by registered or certified mail, return receipt requested, or by facsimile to the party to whom such notice is directed, at the address as set forth above, or the facsimile number provided by such party, or to such other address or facsimile number as such party shall have designated by notice hereunder. Unless otherwise specified, notices shall be deemed given when the return receipt is received or upon receipt of an appropriate facsimile answer back after transmission of the facsimile.

13. **Waiver**

Any waiver of any right or default hereunder shall be effective only in the instance given and shall not operate as or imply a waiver of any similar right or default on any subsequent occasion.

14. **Entire Agreement**

This Agreement and the attached Schedules constitute the entire Agreement between the parties pertaining to the subject matter hereof and supersede all prior and contemporaneous agreements, negotiations and understandings, oral or written. This Agreement may be modified only by an instrument in writing duly executed by both parties.

15. **Enforceability**

If any provision or clause of this Agreement is found by a court of competent jurisdiction to be void, illegal, or unenforceable, that provision or clause shall be modified by the court so as to render it valid and enforceable; or, if such modification is impossible or the court is unable under the law to make the modification, then that provision or clause shall be regarded as stricken from the Agreement. In either event, the parties agree that the remainder of this Agreement shall remain in full force and effect.

16. **Governing Law**

This Agreement shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts.

Re: License Agreement with EBSCO Publishing, Inc.

Dear Mike:

We have enjoyed working with you, on behalf of the Connecticut Supreme Court Historical Society ("CSCHS"), to review, advise and assist in negotiating the proposed License Agreement ("License Agreement") with EBSCO Publishing, Inc. ("EP"). A copy of the current, proposed final, draft of the License Agreement is enclosed. By way of background, we understand that the primary goal of the License Agreement is to increase exposure to the Journal and its articles, by including them in one or more EBSCO products. Arrangements of this type are common among scholarly journals such as yours.

The purpose of this letter is to provide a general overview of the License Agreement, to assist the CSCHS Board in considering the terms of the License Agreement. This summary does not detail or discuss all of the terms of the License Agreement, and we encourage the Board to fully review the License Agreement in its entirety.

In sum, the License Agreement grants EP a non-exclusive license to include certain content published by CSCHS in its *Connecticut Supreme Court History* journal (the "Journal") in one or more of EP's online database and similar products (a current list is included in Schedule 2 of the License Agreement), to be made available to EP's authorized Users. (1.8, 2.1) As between EP and CSCHS, CSCHS will retain the copyright in the content. (2.2, 6.1)

The License Agreement contains a number of provisions which we believe, based on our review and experience with other licensing arrangements, are typical of agreements of this type and provide reasonable protection for CSCHS. For example, as noted above, the license is non-exclusive, such that CSCHS may continue to publish the content when and how it deems

appropriate. (2.1) EP may not change the editorial content of articles, but may only insert subject fields and other technical applications to facilitate searching and the like. (1.1)

The License Agreement provides an opportunity for CSCHS to earn royalties in exchange for sublicensing by EP, if agreed to by CSCHS. (2.5) (Royalties also may be earned for use of certain products by university Users as part of a paid service, which we understand will not apply here.) (2.1, 4) We understand that CSCHS will not opt to authorize sublicensing in exchange for additional royalties at this time, given its primary goal to increase exposure of the Journal. (2.5, Schedule 3.)

Consistent with this goal, the License Agreement allows EP to use CSCHS's trademarks (if any), and the Journal's logo or cover images, in marketing and promotion, but with certain limits. (2.4) The License Agreement allows EP to include pre-existing and future Journal content along with full text and metadata elements to facilitate access by major search engines. (2.7) For its part, the Journal is required to make best efforts to include notice in its masthead indicating that the Journal is included in EP's products. (2.6)
