



## Judicial Branch Posting Podcasts to Assist Attorneys in Meeting Educational Requirements

Effective Monday, Jan. 7, the Judicial Branch began posting podcasts entitled *Calendar Call* on its website to assist Connecticut attorneys in meeting their minimum continuing legal education requirement. A new podcast will be posted every other Monday.

The podcasts last about a half-hour and include such topics as: how to comply with the MCLE rule, the Client Security Fund, the Treatment Pathways Program, and opening and maintaining a client funds account.

Unless otherwise exempt, attorneys admitted in Connecticut must certify annually on their registration form required by Practice Book §2-27(d) that they have completed 12 credit hours of continuing legal education in the previous calendar year. Of those 12 credits, at least two must be in ethics and/or professionalism.
