### **Location No. 1 – Old State House**

### **Location No. 2 – Old Judiciary Room at State Capitol**

- 11:45 a.m. to 12 p.m. Professor Matthew Warshauer of Central Connecticut State University will give a presentation about the significance of the Old Judiciary Room.
- 12 p.m. to 1 p.m. Oral argument in *State v. Andre Campbell*, an appeal in a criminal case involving whether a common hallway in a college dormitory is part of one's residence or abode where the hallway is used to access bathrooms, kitchens and other areas necessary to life.

### **Location No. 3 – Supreme Court Courtroom**

- 2:45 p.m. to 3 p.m. State Librarian Kendall Wiggin will give a presentation about the significance of the Supreme Court/State Library Building.
- 3 p.m. to 4 p.m. Oral argument in *Hong Pham v. Commissioner of Social Services*, an appeal involving whether public act violates plaintiffs' equal protection rights by effectively excluding them from qualifying for state-funded medical assistance based on alienage.
