Notice of Declaratory Ruling Proceeding

The Connecticut State Board of Chiropractic Examiners hereby gives notice of its intention to issue a declaratory ruling pursuant to Conn. Gen. Stat. § 4-176 on the following issue:

Is it within the scope of practice for a licensed Chiropractic Physician in Connecticut to perform the Federal Aviation Administration BasicMed comprehensive medical examination as set forth in 14 C.F.R. §§ 61.23, 68.5 and 68.7 and complete the required Comprehensive Medical Examination Checklist?

The Connecticut State Board of Chiropractic Examiners (“the Board”) has prepared this notice in accordance with the Uniform Administrative Procedure Act (“UAPA”), Connecticut General Statute § 4-166 *et seq.*, and specifically Conn. Gen. Stat. § 4-176.

All persons seeking status to participate must petition the Board by March 15, 2018. All requests seeking status to participate in this matter shall be submitted in writing in accordance with § 4-176(d) of the Connecticut General Statutes and § 19a-9-26 through § 19a-9-28 of the Regulations of Connecticut State Agencies. All filings to be submitted to the Board shall be sent to the Department of Public Health, 410 Capitol Avenue MS#13PHO, P.O. Box 340308, Hartford, Connecticut, 06134-0308. It is anticipated that the Board will rule on petitions for status by April 1, 2018.

By law, a declaratory ruling constitutes a statement of agency law which is binding upon those who participate in the hearing, and may also be utilized by the Connecticut State Board of Chiropractic Examiners, on a case by case basis, in future proceedings before it.

NOTICE OF ADOPTED STREAM FLOW CLASSIFICATIONS
CONNECTICUT RIVER BASIN

In accordance with the Connecticut Regulations of Connecticut State Agencies Section 26-141b-5, the Commissioner of the Connecticut Department of Energy and Environmental Protection hereby gives notice that the Department, through consideration of the factors required by and following the procedures specified in the regulations, has adopted stream flow classifications for the rivers and streams of the Connecticut River Basin. The stream flow classification of a stream or river segment is based on ecological conditions and human use characteristics, and determines flow management goals and applicable flow standards for that segment.

The maps of the stream flow classifications are available on-line at www.ct.gov/deep/streamflow. Such maps include river and stream segments in the following towns: Avon, Barkhamsted, Berlin, Bloomfield, Bolton, Bristol, Burl-

ington, Canton, Chester, Colchester, Colebrook, Cromwell, Deep River, Durham, East Granby, East Haddam, East Hampton, East Hartford, East Lyme, East Windsor, Ellington, Enfield, Essex, Farmington, Glastonbury, Granby, Haddam, Hartford, Hartland, Harwinton, Hebron, Lyme, Manchester, Marlborough, Middlefield, Middletown, New Britain, New Hartford, Newington, Norfolk, Old Lyme, Old Saybrook, Plainville, Plymouth, Portland, Rocky Hill, Salem, Simsbury, Somers, South Windsor, Stafford, Suffield, Tolland, Vernon, West Hartford, Wethersfield, Winchester, Windsor, and Windsor Locks.
