Notice of Suspension of Attorney

CV19-6093890-S, OFFICE OF CHIEF DISCIPLINARY COUNSEL VS. LOUIS RUBANO. SUPERIOR COURT, JUDICIAL DISTRICT OF NEW HAVEN, JANUARY 14, 2020.

ORDER: The court has reviewed and considered the proposed orders from the Disciplinary Counsel and the respondent and it is hereby ordered; the respondent, Louis Rubano, juris number 416402, is suspended from the practice of law in Connecticut for a period of nine months commencing February 1, 2020. This is straight nine month suspension with no probationary period during said nine months. The respondent shall comply with Practice Book 2-47B (Restrictions on the activities of deactivated attorneys). The respondent's failure to comply with this order shall be considered misconduct and may subject the respondent to additional discipline. The court shall retain jurisdiction in this matter. The respondent shall complete a CLE course addressing the handling of third party liens in personal injury cases under Connecticut law and provide proof of the same to the Disciplinary Counsel. The court will not order Louis Rubano to apply for reinstatement after his suspension is completed pursuant to Practice Book 2-53. Louis Rubano does not present a substantial risk to the bar or the public. He will be automatically reinstated to the bar after his period of suspension is completed. The court will not stay his suspension.
